
<u>Sailing</u>

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SATURDAY SAILING

Welcome to the 2022/23 sailing season, our massive CSC <u>sailing program</u> endeavours to deliver events suitable for skippers and crews of all ages, be they beginners or rock stars. A notable change this season is CSC Cruising Division 2 being introduced with shorter courses to encourage our smaller keelboats to get on the race track.

The CSC program has begun, but it's not too late to <u>register</u>, check your program for this weekend's events. There is a race for everyone. Keep a close eye on our CSC website <u>cronullasc.com</u>, social media and messaging for important updates.

To kick off the keelboat season, CSC and RMYC-PH introduced an interclub mini-series. Ten boats sailed the short haul course to Botany Bay, with Knockabout winning the sheep station. Eight sailed the inshore course, with team Sailmates coming second. Go CSC! The RMYC crew made us all very welcome at their results presentation afterwards. The next interclub event will be announced soon.

Another keelboat initiative, the CSC Short Ocean series, starts its second season this weekend where we offer selected short haul courses of up to 22 miles for our combined Cat4 Inshore 1 and Offshore fleets. This series is designed for keelboats wanting a broader experience and those that might aspire to big regattas like Sail Port Stephens <u>SPS2023</u> or even Hamo race week and beyond.

Our new keelboat handicapper John Zagame has moved us over to the super-slick SailSys scoring software. Be patient, we are still learning, but results will be posted ASAP on the CSC website <u>**RESULTS**</u> <u>page</u>.

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SUNDAY SAILING

Race 1 was held on 9-Oct, and after some strong winds overnight, an assessment of the race course closer to start time confirmed conditions were very much sailable, with 3 boats – Aqua Pest, Sköl and Turtle – quickly rigging and making their way to the start line for a rapid-fire 4-lap windward/leeward course in a 13-18 knot S'ly. As is common in the Estuary in these conditions both wind speed and direction were varied, with Aqua Pest (Drew & Angela) taking an early lead on the first downwind leg by hooking into a good bullet on the Western side of the course. Sköl (Bernard & Luke) and Turtle (Jess & Joss) had a great battle which saw the lead change several times, with Sköl out-foxing Turtle to take second and third place respectively. Aqua Pest extended their lead throughout the race to take a comfortable win, completing the 8 leg course in just half an hour.







Race 2 was held on 16-Oct with a much more benign forecast than the previous week, which saw some of the "fair weather sailors" dust off their boats and hit the race track. A great little Figure 8 course was laid by our starter Ali, which despite the soggy 5-8 knot ESE still gave some great tight reaches, allowing the crews to stretch their legs out on the wire. As the start gun drew closer it was evident the bulk of the fleet has forgotten how to start during the winter months, with all bar Aqua Pest (Drew & Angela) 30+ seconds late off the line, giving them a handy lead right from the get-go. Sköl (Bernard & Luke) and Turtle (Jess & Joss) once again had a good battle for second and third, with Eyas (Pete & Mark), Smashed (Katelyn & Thomas) & After Midknight (Craig & Tobie) battling it out behind them. Aqua Pest once again took a convincing win in the light conditions, from Sköl in second and Turtle third.
